LOOKING AFTER KNYVETON GARDENS

Since the election, Councillor Sara Armstrong has been working tirelessly to establish whether money from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) can be used to improve the environment of Knyveton Gardens. In December she was delighted to hear that her application for £50,000 has been successful.

Sara said: "This is **brilliant news** for Knyveton Gardens and the communities who use it. The enhancements that this funding will be used for include **play equipment** for younger ages, **accessibility** improvements, vegetation management, a **water fountain**, better **signage** including a noticeboard and **toilet provision**."

Residents have raised concerns about **anti-social behaviour** in the park. There are **opportunities for local community members** to come together to maintain the changes and improvements. NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM FOR EAST CLIFF & SPRINGBOURNE

One of Sara's **campaign priorities** for East Cliff & Springbourne is the formation of a **Neighbourhood Forum**, which is the necessary first step towards creating a **Neighbourhood Plan** (NP). The Forum will be made up of **community members**, who together will work to ensure that residents have a **clear voice on local planning matters**.

A Neighbourhood Plan will give our community the ability to **protect government grants** for the local area and make more **applications for funding** to improve the local built environment. We need at least **21 members of the community** to form a Neighbourhood Forum. If you would like to **become involved**, please contact Sara, details below.

SUPPORTING RESIDENTS

In November the corner of Grants Avenue and Harrison Avenue **flooded** again, as it has **every time there is heavy rainfall** for the past decade. Despite multiple reports to the council by local residents, the situation was not rectified until **hard working local councillor Sara Armstrong** took matters into her own hands. Sara, along with fellow Green Councillor Alasdair Keddie and volunteer John-Paul Hay, managed to **manually clear the drain**.

Working with the council's Highways Maintenance department, Sara and her team found that **part of the drain had been broken** during some previous roadworks carried out by a utility company, **allowing tree roots to ingress** and cause a blockage. The Highways Maintenance team will



follow up with the responsible party to make good on the damage that was caused.

GREEN GROUP TACKLES KNIFE CRIME

In September BCP Council passed a motion proposed by Sara Armstrong and



seconded by fellow Green Councillor Joe Salmon addressing the pressing issue of **knife crime** in our communities.

The motion reflects local Green councillors' unwavering commitment to push for more action to ensure the safety and well-being of young people in our communities. It highlights the importance of preventing the loss of lives due to knife crime and emphasises the role of the community in creating safe environments and offering positive role models for children and young people.

Sara said: "We need to get to the root causes of knife crime and gang culture amongst our young people and work together to find solutions. More police on the street is one thing, and we need more effective support services for young people - we need to reverse the decline in public services. In passing this motion we're sending a powerful message that we are here for young people, we are listening to our communities, and we are taking action to fight the scourge of knife crime. Knives have no place here."
